Consecration

On the afternoon/evening of **Sunday, September 30 at 4:00 PM**, our congregation will joyfully celebrate **Simchat Torah**. Our celebration will include a beautiful service of **Consecration** for students who are beginning their religious school experience. In addition, those students who began religious school within the last couple years but were unable to participate in Consecration are invited to be consecrated as well. Consecration is a special ceremony in which students are blessed as they start their formal Jewish education. Because Simchat Torah marks our finishing of the yearly cycle of Torah readings, as well as our turning to begin it once again, it is a fitting time to recognize these students' entry into the never-ending process of Jewish learning. The consecrants also will be presented with a small Torah and a certificate to commemorate this *simcha*.

SHABBAT TOGETHER!

Student-Led Family Services

Again this year, in place of our traditional grade-level Shabbat Services, there will be two (2) Friday Evening Shabbat Services to which all of our Religious School and Hebrew School students will be invited to attend and participate by helping Rabbi Elder to lead the service. Each student will help (either independently or with a friend/s) with a part of the service with which they are most comfortable - whether it is doing a reading in English, leading a prayer in Hebrew or English, blessing the Shabbat candles, singing a song, etc. We are hoping that all students attend both services this year. They will have an opportunity, prior to each service, to prepare during Hebrew School and/or Religious School what they will lead. It is vital that our students attend Hakafa Shabbat services while they are enrolled in school. We provide these opportunities so that students become familiar with our service and know what to expect when they become b'nai mitzvah. In addition, it is a great way for your family to meet and get to know other Hakafa families and to promote community among our students across grades. We are providing the following dates – in advance – so that you can note them on your calendars NOW and so that we can have robust participation from the students. All services will be followed by a special oneg in honor of the students.

PROGRAM DETAILS:

Kindergarten through Grade 2

- Students in Kindergarten through Second Grade attend Religious School on Sunday mornings.
- In addition to core curriculum at each grade level, students in Kindergarten through Second Grade participate in Jewish and Hebrew singing, Israeli dancing, and an introduction to Hebrew on a weekly basis.

Grades 3 through 8

- Students in Grades 3 through 7 attend Religious School on Sunday mornings and Hebrew School on Tuesday afternoons. Our 8th Graders attend Religious School on Sunday mornings only.
- On Sundays, in addition to core curriculum at each grade level, students participate in mixed-grade (3rd-5th and 6th-8th) *chugim* (specialty workshops).
- Our Hebrew curriculum on Tuesday afternoons (for grades 3-7) focuses on language acquisition with emphasis on reading fluency, basic conversation, and applications to Torah study and Jewish life.

High School Program

- In place of weekly classes and/or retreats, students in 9th through 11th grades meet (by grade) four times a year on Sunday late afternoons (4:00-6:15 PM). These four class sessions incorporate dinner with all 9th-11th grade students together.
- In place of participation in the four class sessions, students in grade 12 prepare for Confirmation at the end of the year with two class sessions and two service prep sessions over the course of the year. They also participate in two workshops that focus on Jewish life after high school.
- All high school students (grades 9-12) meet three times during the year to do social action and/or community projects/outings.
- All high school students (grades 9-12) have the opportunity to participate in an educational out-of-town trip each year.
- **NEW THIS YEAR:** We will kick off our program with a BBQ in September for all 9th-12th graders.
