GENERALLY:

Another good place to start is to first check with your village hall or civic center.

Most community recycling program will take: newspaper, direct mail advertising, magazines, catalogues, cardboard, cans, tin foil, glass bottles, and plastic with the #1-5

Remember the first "R": REFUSE, recycle, re-use, re-purpose. Don't take those plastic bags; buy in bulk and bring your own container; make your own condiments / cleaners.

FOAM:

Block foam and clean food take out containers can be taken to the Winnetka Public Works building lobby, 8:30am to 4:00pm, 1390 Willow Road

Peanuts can be taken to UPS stores

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE:

Motor oil, cleaning products, oil based paints, etc.

COMPUTER / ELECTRONICS:

CARTRIDGES (INK JET AND TONER):

Glencoe Public Works (by appointment)

BATTERIES:

Alkaline batteries: Glencoe Public Works; Glenview Village Hall; Wilmette Village Hall; Winnetka Public Works

Car batteries: Wilmette Auto Care, 803 Greenbay Road; Fred's Service, 574 Greenbay Road, Winnetka

PAINT (LATEX):

Usually you can dry it out (sand / kitty litter) and leave with your recycling.

TEXTILES (TORN/STAINED CLOTHING, ETC.)

Goodwill Industries: drop off on Ridge in Wilmette; Northbrook, 4131 Dundee Rd.
Firearms Training Center, 1180 Half Day Road, Highland Park

MEDICATIONS:

Usually your village hall / civic center will take these

KITCHEN / GARDEN WASTE:

Compost these!

HANGERS AND PLASTIC FROM CLEANERS:

Take back to cleaners for recycling / reuse
